Supported Living

We give young adults with learning disabilities the opportunity to live independently in their own home.

The bedrock of independent living is the home environment. Langdon provides the practical and emotional help and guidance needed to support our members to live independent lives.

Our support staff help members to master important everyday living skills, such as household chores, shopping and travelling.

Through our unique network of supported living accommodation in London, Hertfordshire and Manchester, we support 94 people in 51 houses and flats.

Our Outreach service enables people who are not part of one of our communities to commission Langdon's services.

Education

Hundreds of young people with learning difficulties have benefited from our individualised education programmes.

Langdon College, in Manchester, provides access to a range of nationally recognised qualifications, independent living skills, vocational training, work experience, and social and leisure development, all within a Jewish ethos.

Our extended curriculum allows our students the opportunity to practice and develop their skills in a real home life setting, developing their independence with all daily living skills, such as meal preparation, domestic skills, community access, travel and shopping.

Alongside the residential and day programmes at the College, new day education programmes in London are being introduced.

Employment


We are huge believers in the importance of work for bringing a sense of worth and independence.

We are very proud that over 90% of Langdon members work, two-thirds of whom are in paid employment.

We provide the support as they take their first steps into the world of work, and beyond, working with visionary employers who see past the disability to the value of the person they are employing.

We help Langdon members develop new skills to increase their employability, find job vacancies, help with completion of application forms, prepare them for interviews and help them make the transition from benefits to paid employment.

At Langdon, we help develop the life skills that foster sociability and friendships, and facilitate activities, trips and holidays to provide the basis for a lively social life.

Activities include pub nights, coffee afternoons, sports, cinema and theatre outings, and trips further afield, including annual holidays. For 12-19 year-olds, Langdon's Brady Clubs offer the opportunity to meet new people, make friends and have fun.
