Virtual latkah making with Denise Philips

Please get the following things ready and join us on Zoom.

Ingredients



3 large potatoes peeled and grated



1 small onion peeled and grated



2 eggs



2 tablespoons of self-raising flour



1 teaspoon of baking powder



Salt and freshly-ground black pepper



400ml of vegetable oil for frying

Equipment



Make your own Falafel

Falafel ingredients



400g of tinned chickpeas



2 dessert spoons of plain flour



2 spring onions, finely chopped



half a teaspoon of salt



1 teaspoon of ground cumin



freshly ground black pepper



1 lemon, zest only



4 teaspoons of olive oil

Salad ingredients



3 tbsp olive oil



1 lemon, juice only



half of a cucumber, peeled and thinly sliced



2 tomatoes, roughly chopped



1 round lettuce, washed, leaves torn

To serve ·····



4 pitta breads



plain yoghurt



chilli sauce



hummus

Make your own Falafel continued

Method

- 1. Put the chickpeas into a saucepan and mash with a potato masher until you can get this as smooth as you can. (If you are using a non-stick pan, use a plastic masher to avoid spoiling the pan.)
- 2. Add the spring onions, cumin, lemon zest, flour and salt. Season with lots of black pepper and mix well with a wooden spoon.
- **3.** Using your hands, out of the mixture make six even-sized balls and flatten a little.
- 4. Put frying pan onto the cooker hob on a low heat. Add 2 teaspoons of the oil. Add the falafel balls and cook for 4 minutes. Flip onto the other side and add another 2 teaspoons of oil to the pan. Cook for a further 3–4 minutes, or until golden brown and crisp on both sides.

- 5. Whilst this is cooking, put the cucumber, tomato and lettuce into a large bowl. Squeeze the juice of half the lemon into a small bowl, add a pinch of salt and pepper and using a fork whisk together with the olive oil to make a dressing. Pour over the salad and mix well.
- 6. Lightly toast the pitta breads and then carefully slice open along one side using a sharp knife.
- 7. When you are ready to serve the food, put a little salad in each pitta, add some of the falafels and add a squeeze of juice from the other lemon half. Add a spoonful of yoghurt, chilli sauce or hummus (or a bit of all three!).
- **8.** Serve with the salad left over next to the stuffed pitta on a plate.

The story of Chanukah

During the time of the second temple, the land of Israel came into the hands of King Antiochus. Antiochus came under pressure from the Romans, who demanded lots of money in taxes, which he then made the Jews unfairly pay. More attacks followed and laws forbidding Jewish practice and study of the Torah were brought in.

The Syrian-Greek Army continued to force idol-worship and killed anyone who didn't listen to their commands.

However, when they went to Modiin and tried to force Matisyahu to worship at the altar, he refused and fought back, beginning the resistance of the Maccabees.

The Maccabees returned to Jerusalem after defeating the armies who tried to attack them in the hills of Judea.

When they returned to the temple, they removed the idols and built a new menorah to honour Hashem. They went to look for some olive oil to light it, but found only enough to last for one day.

Then, a miracle happened. The olive oil burned for 8 days!

Israel is the only Jewish state on Earth and home to more Jews than anywhere else in the world. This ancient country in the Middle East is bordered by the Dead Sea, Lebanon, Palestine, Jordan, Syria and Egypt. The northern portion of Israel is snowy and mountainous, while the south is a desert. Most people live in the coastal region. The city of Jericho in Israel is one of the oldest cities on Earth, first occupied more than 11,000 years ago.

Israel is perhaps the most religiously complicated country on Earth. Israel became a Jewish state in 1946. After the Nazi invasion of Europe, many Jews had no home. They settled in Israel as their homeland. The German government gives Israel \$500 million every year to compensate for the losses of World War II.

Europe, Canada or America. Israel is a modern country with modern homes and lifestyles.

Blessings for Chanukah

To commemorate the miracle of Chanukah we light our own personal menorahs every night of Chanukah with our family, friends and wider community. While we light the menorah, we say the following blessings.

First blessing

Ba-ruch A-tah Ado-nai E-lo-he-nu Me-lech haolam a-sher ki-de-sha-nu be-mitz-vo-tav ve-tzi-va-nu le-had-lik ner Cha-nu-kah. בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה אֲדֹנָי אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶּךְ הָעוֹלָם אֲשֶׁר קִדְּשָׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתָיו וְצִוְּנוּ לְהַדְּלִיק נֵר תַנְכָּה

Blessed are You, Lord our Gd, King of the universe, who has sanctified us with His commandments, and commanded us to kindle the Chanukah light.

Second blessing

Blessed are You, Lord our Gd, King of the universe, who performed miracles for our forefathers in those days, at this time.

Third blessing

This is recited only on the first night (or the first time lighting this Chanukah)
